Zoning may sound boring, but it's important to how a neighborhood (and the city) grows and develops. DC is in the process of rewriting its zoning code, which dates from the 1950's. The **WPCA Fall meeting** will be on Tuesday October 16th at 7 pm at Stanford. The Associate Director of the DC Office of Planning will discuss its proposals, with emphasis on what will — and will not — change in Woodley Park. There will be time to ask questions and to tell OP what you think.

Saturday October 20th is the date for the **Woodley Park historical talk and walking tour**. We'll meet at 1 pm for the talk and some light refreshments. There is a proposal to redevelop a Connecticut Avenue townhouse (number 2852) by gutting the existing building, dividing it into smaller units and putting a four-story addition in the rear, creating a total of nine units. The proposal will be reviewed by the ANC and by HPRB in October. A representative of the developer has been invited to attend the October 3 Executive Committee meeting (to which all are welcome). One of the changes that the Office of Planning is proposing in the new zoning regulations is to have somewhat different rules for businesses and apartment buildings in areas that have access to good transit, so-called "**transit zones**." The Federation of Citizens Associations will have a program to discuss these aspects of OP's proposal on Tuesday September 18 from 6:45 to 9 pm at All Souls Memorial Episcopal Church, 2300 Cathedral Avenue.
