Woodley Park News

ANC redistricting. This week the Ward 3 ANC Redistricting Task Force approved [a map for new ANCs](#). Woodley Park will remain in the same ANC as Woodland Normanstone and the part of Cleveland Park East of 34th Street.

Wardman Park. As reported last week, HPRB instructed Carmel to engage more with the community on the design of its proposed buildings. [HPRB's report](#) of its action says:

The Board expressed their support for the building mass and site plan but cited the extent of glazing on Building A, the irregular ends of the buildings facing Woodley Road, and the landscaping fronting Woodley Road as areas that should be revised in order to improve their compatibility with the landmark. The Board deferred taking a formal action and vote in order to allow the ANC and community further opportunity to understand and provide comments on the design compatibility of the proposed project.

To that end, WPCA will host Carmel at a Zoom meeting on Thursday March 17 at 7:30 pm. The first part of the meeting will focus on the design compatibility issue relevant to HPRB. Thereafter, Carmel will take questions/comments on other issues related to its plans. Questions can be submitted via me in advance (by COB Tuesday) or asked via Zoom. By way of further background, ANC3C considered the Carmel proposal at its meeting late last month. It adopted [a resolution](#) sponsored by the Commissioner whose district includes this property. The resolution opposed Carmel's proposal and requested that Carmel add 300 more units to the property, bringing the total to 1200, and that 35% of the units be affordable.
