WP business district. At its meeting last week, ANC 3C passed <u>a resolution</u> that asks the Zoning Commission to repeal a zoning code provision that is designed to ensure that there is enough ground-floor space in the WP business district for neighborhood-serving retail and service establishments. It did this without any engagement with the community; the subject was not even on the agenda of its own planning and zoning committee (though a similar resolution regarding Cleveland Park was discussed there). All four WP commissioners supported the resolution.

The provision in question puts a limit of 25% on the ground floor space that restaurants may occupy. Above that, a restaurant would need to get a special exception from the BZA. There is no limit on upstairs restaurants in WP. Because of non-enforcement by DCRA and the special exception process, restaurants now occupy roughly 34% of the ground floor space.

We all like restaurants, of course. But any additional restaurant over the 34% would have to displace another business – a market, a dry cleaner, a florist, a hair salon.

Mayor Bowser's proposed budget calls for the elimination of the Circulator line that terminates in Woodley Park. WPCA will write to CM Frumin to ask him to work for its retention.
