96 bus. WMATA is proposing a redesign of its bus network. One change is the elimination of the 96 route. The 96 runs through the center of Woodley Park and connects us to Tenleytown (and its public schools), Cathedral Commons (and its grocery), Adams Morgan and U Street. It allows workers from those neighborhoods and points east to get to jobs in WP and elsewhere in Ward 3. It is a route to school for students and staff at Maret, WIS, NCS, Sidwell and various DCPS. Connecticut Ave Development Guidelines. OP has released its <u>initial draft</u>. The document contemplates adding seven stories to the CVS building at the corner of Calvert and to the three buildings just south of the Metro entrance. The draft includes a long section on attractive streetscape improvements, but it does not propose to have the government implement any of them; rather, OP wants them to be used by private parties when designing projects in the area. OP staff will be at the Library next Saturday, April 29, from 11 am to 1 pm to chat with neighbors. Comments on the draft may be provided by May 26 via OP's website.
